The Help (Aug 5): Set in 1960s Jackson, Mississippi, this page-turner focuses on white Southern households and the black domestic maids who toiled in those households. The white characters range from "politely racist" Junior Leaguers to matrons who openly despise and mistreat the very maids who help them raise their children. Speaking primarily through three voices (regal black maid Aibileen's, and sassy cook Minny's, as well as 21-year-old Old Miss graduate Eugenia "Skeeter" Phelan's), the author writes of a room "full of cake-eating, Tab-drinking, cigarette-smoking women" planning a fundraiser for the "Poor Starving Children of Africa." Author Kathryn Stockett doesn't hit us over the head with the ironies inherent in these 1960's situations. She does, however, get her point across, all the while portraying her characters - whether black or white - with insight and humor. DreamWorks Studios recently announced a film version of the "The Help."

Labor Day (Sept 2): In a review of her coming-of-age book Labor Day, author Joyce Maynard states that the idea for Labor Day came to her in a dream. She wrote the book in 10 days, for she was eager to discover how things would turn out for her characters. By Maynard's account, the book, set in a small New Hampshire town in 1987, contains many of her "own obsessions: being a single mother, the loneliness of being a boy who is trying to be the man of the family." The story focuses on 13-year-old Henry, whose chance encounter with an apparent drifter named Frank forever changes Henry's life - and the life of Henry's mother Adele.

The Girl Who Kicked the Hornet's Nest (Oct 7): Late Swedish writer Stieg Larsson's final novel in his Millennium Trilogy is said by reviewers, once again, to be an exhilarating demonstration of "Larsson's mastery of the unexpected." Lisbeth Salander, the unorthodox young computer hacker involved in a long-distance (online) relationship with publisher Michael Blomkvist, lies in her hospital bed, recuperating from serious injuries she received during events at the end of Larsson's previous novel. From this hospital bed (where she spends most of the third novel), Lisbeth puts her brilliant mind to clever use in outwitting the long arm of the Swedish Security Service, her silent but most mortal enemy. The film version of Hornet's Nest enjoyed a popular European debut in November 2009

The minutes of the May 18th meeting were approved prior to the meeting via e-mail.

Newly elected members, Jeff Cannon, Joe Johnson and Sondra Swan were welcomed.

An e-mail was sent to the membership asking for their input on social activities. There was no response.

Membership, Rhonda Whisenant.

Currently there are 597 members of which 318 are golf members, 64 are tennis members and 215 are social members.

There are 2 corporate memberships with a total of 5 individual members; however there has not been any recent interest in additional corporate memberships.

Rhonda is polling the new members for information about potential new members.

New members are being assigned a Council Member to help assimilate them into Club activities.

Linda complimented Robert Dugger for creating excitement among the new members with Couples Golf.

Joe Johnson recommended having a Thorn tree representative at the Best Southwest Luncheon at the MCM Grande, Wednesday June 9. Ten local mayors, as well as Bill Lively, President of the Super Bowl Committee, will be there. The Best Southwest luncheon occurs quarterly and is a prime opportunity to promote Thorn tree. Rhonda Whisenant said she would attend.

Finance Committee, Randy Crews.

Financial comparisons are year-to-date compared to same time last year

Monthly dues are down 8% compared to the same time last year.

Food and beverage is down 13.6% compared to the same time last year.

Total Revenue is down 12% compared to the same time last year.

Total Expenses are down 11% compared to the same time last year.

Operating Income/EBITA is down 17.4% compared to the same time last year.

Golf Committee, Rob Dunn.

The greens will be aerified June 21 and mid August.

The City of Desoto will be contacted about the debris in the creek in front of #3 tee box.

A structural engineer will be contacted about a solution for the continuing problems with the pump on #16.

The grass around #13 green is to be cut at 2-3 inches.

The collars of many greens are common Bermuda, which creates difficulty getting the club on the ball. There is not enough manpower to verticut these areas. (Robert recommends using a hybrid or 3 wood to putt in these areas.)

The main pump is broken and needs to be rebuilt. A rental pump is being used in the meantime.

During the growing season, June to September, #6 will be open to cart traffic on a limited basis.

Scholarship Committee, Glen Smith.

Glen recommends that the new Committee begin promptly to establish scholarship qualifications.

A packet from last years Committee is available for the new Committees use.

Managers Report, Scott Carter.

The swimming pool pumps electrical problem has been fixed.

Memorial Day festivities were very successful.

Old Business.

Bumper stickers are a work in progress.

A speaker has been installed in the Nineteenth Hole.

New Business.

Thanks to Gulzar Rana who donated a large grill to the Club.

Alice Rana spoke of the need to resurface the tennis courts. Sprinklers need to be adjusted so the courts stay dry.

BOG Officer Election

Per BOG Policies and Procedures, those eligible to vote in the election of BOG officers are the 9 elected members, the past chair, and the chair appointee. The Chair does not vote except in the case of a tie.

Hoyt Sexton nominated Bob Libbey to be the Chair. Rob Dunn seconded. Gary Davidson motioned that nominations be closed; and Bob was elected unanimously.

Alice Rana nominated Hoyt Sexton to be Vice Chair. Paula Easter seconded. Randy Crews nominated Joe Johnson to be Vice Chair. Gary Davidson seconded. By a vote of 7 to 3, Hoyt was elected Vice Chair.

Alice Rana nominated Sondra Swan to be Secretary. There were no additional nominations. Sondra Swan was elected.

Bob Libbey passed out *What Does It Mean To Serve On The Board Of Governors*, as well as the Board Policies and Procedures document.

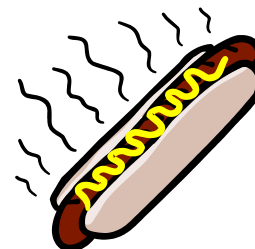

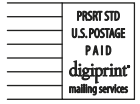
