Outliers: The Story of Success (May 6). Malcolm Gladwell examines the factors contributing to high levels of success. He presents, through anecdotal examples, his thesis that it is often not the most highly talented or brilliant who achieve phenomenal success. Along with Gladwell's "10,000-Hour Rule" of persistence and practice, he shows that societal factors and opportunity - as well as the influence of culture, family and friends - contribute to success or lack thereof. Nothing new there! Nevertheless, the anecdotal material and the manner in which the author presents it make for an interesting non-fiction book.

The Girl Who Played with Fire (June 3): Late Swedish writer Stieg Larsson's second novel in his "Millennium Trilogy" again features a journalist/publisher and his young computer-hacker friend Lisbeth (she of the dragon tattoo from the first novel). This Nordic thriller critiques Swedish society and "explores misogynistic men at all levels and the women they exploit." Taking the law into her own hands to expose a slick sex-trafficking business and the corrupt government officials who cover it up, Lisbeth once again amazes with her unorthodox stealth and extraordinary brain power. Readers find themselves quietly cheering for the upright male protagonist journalist - and especially for the secretive girl who hates men for very good reasons of her own!

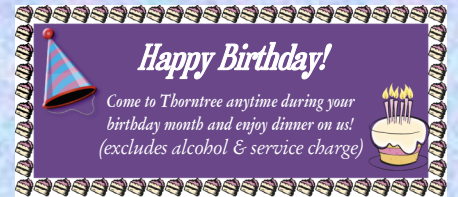

# GOLF ACTIVITIES

I am glad to report that the cold weather has left us, the golf course is in great shape and I made it through my first 30 days unharmed. I spent my first month observing the golf operations, meeting and greeting most of you and getting to know the staff. I would like to share some of my observations with you. Some of these are golf etiquette issues and some relate to making the golf operation work smoother. But in sharing these observations with you, we can make this a better club environment and attract future members.

- We ask that **everyone check in the golf shop before play**. This not only helps us keep proper records, but in case of emergencies we can locate people.
  - **Driving carts too close to tees or greens, driving over ropes, post** or areas that a cart should not be, is violated regularly. I understand it is an inconvenience to have to walk at times, but this is a matter of protecting our course and providing our golfers with the best possible playing surfaces year round.
  - I have observed groups **stopping after nine holes** for lunch and cutting in front of someone when they return to play the back nine. Play is continuous and any group stopping at the turn will be asked to start over at the first hole or wait until a gap approaches.
  - **Six-somes or more?** The golf shop controls and makes all decisions on the approval of any groups that have 6 or more players in the group. There are times when we will allow groups to play with 6 or more. There are obvious times when we would not allow 6 or more to play. These groups have to adhere to faster groups playing though and still maintain a proper pace of play or the golf shop will ask them to break up.
  - **Driving range set up.** Some changes have already taken place, but more improvements are to come.
  - **Pairing up on carts.** I am amazed to see four and five carts going out for one group. This is not efficient and it is more wear and tear on carts and on the golf course. So please do not be offended when we ask you to pair up in the future.
  - **Divots, sand, ball marks and tees.** Do your best to fill your divots, repair ball marks and if you break a tee pick it up and throw it away.
- Bag Drop** – I am glad to say we are going to improve this part of the operation. We will soon have in place a much better process by which our members can drop off their bags and be serviced by our staff. So please let us help you with your bags from your car when you arrive and depart. Simple drive to the bag drop located next to the golf shop. D36

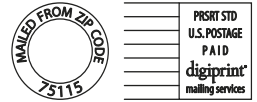
